Any undergraduate in HEST or A&S who is engaged in scholarship with faculty oversight outside of regular class activities can join the program as a DSP Scholar. While working to complete milestones on their project, DSP Scholars also identify and work toward the completion of different professional development goals, such as presenting at conferences or applying to graduate school, activities that the DSP program celebrates along the way.
