Δ- Graduate Coursework: Students planning to do graduate work in mathematical economics or statistics are urged to take MATH 191G (in place of MATH 142G) and MATH 192G. A grade of C- or better is required in 191G.

GENERAL NOTES

Age of Credits: Business course credits completed more than ten years prior to the degree application will be reviewed by the course department head and dean (or a designee) to determine their continued suitability to satisfy current degree, major and minor requirements and learning objectives.

SEASONAL COURSES IN YOUR MAJOR

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS DOUBLE MAJORS

Students may not receive credit for both ECON 489 and IB 489. For this reason, students majoring in both economics and international business must consult with the head of the department to arrange for a suitable substitution.

HONORS COLLEGE:

The highlighted courses reflect options of Honors Courses to take. The Honors College requires students to take a total of 18 credit hours with an honors designation. 6-9 lower division classes and 6-9 upper division classes. These are classes with an HON prefix or courses by contract*. 3 of the total 18 must be a Senior Capstone experience taken under HON 400 or HON 410 or by contract.

Not all of the honors courses highlighted are offered every semester. Be sure to talk to your advisor and to check the Honors College website for a list of approved courses for the semester. Go to the Honors College website → For Students tab → Courses. Look at the courses being offered in Areas IV, V, and Viewing the Wider World. Search for those courses when you register for the semester.

*Honors Course by Contract: Non-Honors courses may count as upper level Honors courses by contracting the course. An Honors Contract is a mechanism for adding an "honors dimension" to a course that is not listed as an honors course. The contract allows honors students to convert a regular non-honors course into an honors course that counts towards graduation with University Honors. If the course is cross-listed as a graduate-level course, doing the graduate work is sufficient. Go to www.honors.nmsu.edu/for-students/honors-courses-by-contract/ for more information.
