- <u>18</u> Credits must be Honors classes or courses by Contract with the Honors College 6-9 lower division credits, 6-9 upper division credits, and a 3 credit Hon 400, internship or thesis
- \*Including Econ credit these two areas must equal 15 credits.
- \*\*A business elective course CANNOT count as a VWW course.
- \*\*\* Honors Course by Contract: Non-Honors courses may count as upper level Honors courses by contracting the course. An Honors Contract is a mechanism for adding an "honors dimension" to a course that is not listed as an honors course (HON prefix). The contract allows honors students to convert a regular non-honors course into an honors course that counts toward graduation with University Honors.
