PRE-NURSING GUIDELINES

STUDENTS CAN EXPECT AT LEAST THREE SEMESTERS OF PREREQUISITE COURSE WORK BEFORE APPLYING TO THE SCHOOL OF NURSING THIS IS A FOUR YEAR, 127-129 DEGREE HOUR PLAN. ALL PRE-MAJOR AND MAJOR COURSES MUST HAVE A "C" OR BETTER. AN APPROPRIATE SCORE IS REQUIRED ON THE MANDATORY STANDARDIZED ADMISSION EXAM TAKEN AT TIME OF APPLICATION

STUDENTS ARE ACCEPTED BASED ON THEIR GPA.AND HESI SCORES. STUDENTS BEGIN THE NURSING PROGRAM IN EITHER THE SPRING OR FALL TERMS.

THE MINIMUM GPA FOR ELIGIBILITY IS 2.75

(THE AVERAGE GPA IS 3.500 OR ABOVE)

TO ENSURE ACADEMIC SUCCESS, PRE-NURSING STUDENTS SHOULD VISIT WITH THEIR ADVISOR EACH SEMESTER. STUDENTS ARE ALSO EXPECTED TO UPDATE ANY CHANGES IN ADDRESS, PHONE, EMAIL, ETC.

WHEN YOU ARE REGISTERED IN THE LAST OF YOUR PREREQUISITES, A NURSING APPLICATION IS REQUIRED AND IS AVAILABLE FROM THE PRE-NURSING ADVISOR IN THE COLLEGE OF HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES, SUITE 110.

FINAL ACCEPTANCE TO THE NURSING PROGRAM IS DETERMINED BY THE SCHOOL OF NURSING AND IS BASED ON YOUR GPA FOR THE PREREQUISITE COURSES AND YOUR SCORES ON THE ADMISSION EXAM. THERE IS A SEPARATE APPLICATION PROCESS BECAUSE ENROLLMENT IS LIMITED EACH FALL AND SPRING SEMESTER
