GENERAL NOTES

Age of Credits: Business course credits completed more than ten years prior to the degree application will be reviewed by the course department head and dean (or a designee) to determine their continued suitability to satisfy current degree, major and minor requirements and learning objectives.

Section M80: Course section M80 is restricted to students completing one of College of Business online Marketing, General Business or Information Systems degree completion programs. Other online sections are open to the NMSU general population.

ASSOCIATE OF PRE-BUSINESS

By completing the lower division requirements for a Bachelor of Business Administration degree or Bachelor of Accountancy degree, you may satisfy the requirements for an Associate's degree in Pre-Business (PBA). Additional PBA degree requirements are a minimum of 60 credit hours; cumulative GPA of 2.0 and the last 15 credits must be earned at NMSU. You may apply for the degree once you have completed the required courses.

SEASONAL COURSES IN YOUR MAJOR

Some courses may be offered seasonally (only fall or spring). Please check with Accounting department for seasonal courses.

ECONOMICS DOUBLE MAJORS

Students may not receive credit for both ECON 489 and IB 489. For this reason, students majoring in both economics and international business must consult with the head of the Economics Department to arrange for a suitable substitution.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

Please discuss these requirements with INTB faculty advisors as soon as you declare this major.

Foreign Language: Students must demonstrate oral and written proficiency at intermediate mid-level according to ACTFL proficiency guidelines.

International Experience: Students must partake of an international experience equivalent to a semester abroad in a university where the language of instruction is not English.

VIEWING A WIDER WORLD

If this degree's require international experience takes the form of study abroad at a foreign university (earning at least 3 credits), it will satisfy one VWW requirement. Please discuss this with INTB faculty advisors if there are any questions or concerns.

^HONORS COLLEGE:

The highlighted courses reflect options of Honors Courses to take. The Honors College requires students to take a total of 18 credit hours with an honors designation. 6-9 lower division classes and 6-9 upper division classes. These are classes with an HON prefix or courses by contract*. 3 of the total 18 must be a Senior Capstone experience taken under HON 400 or HON 410 or by contract.

Not all of the honors courses highlighted are offered every semester. Be sure to talk to your advisor and to check the Honors College website for a list of approved courses for the semester. Go to the Honors College website → For Students tab → Courses. Look at the courses being offered in Areas IV, V, and Viewing the Wider World. Search for those courses when you register for the semester.

*Honors Course by Contract: Non-Honors courses may count as upper level Honors courses by contracting the course. An Honors Contract is a mechanism for adding an "honors dimension" to a course that is not listed as an honors course. If the course is cross-listed as a graduate-level course, doing the graduate work is sufficient. Go to www.honors.nmsu.edu/for-students/honors-courses-by-contract/ for more information.
